Thank you for your comments regarding management of off-road vehicles (ORV) in Cape Hatteras National Seashore. If you have been visiting the Outer Banks for many years, I can understand your concerns regarding increased numbers of ORV use in the National Seashore. I would like to summarize what actions we plan to take in the near future to ensure that the public has a chance to comment on this land management issue.

The National Park Service is currently working towards the development of an ORV management plan and associated federal regulation that will protect valued park resources and provide for recreational access and visitor safety. We plan to use a negotiated rulemaking process to reach consensus among interested parties on the required ORV regulation. More information about our planning process can be obtained at the Cape Hatteras National Seashore Off-Road Vehicle Negotiated Rulemaking and Management Plan project website at http://parkplanning.nps.gov/caha. We plan to initiate public scoping this winter and you may submit comments during the scoping period.

The National Park Service will actively seek and consult with existing and potential visitors, stakeholder organizations, neighbors, and partners when drafting this plan and regulation. Public input, from individuals like you, will be a key component in the development and success of this plan and regulation.
