> permanent fencing" to separate piping plover chicks from vehicles would
> not
> be approved by FWS. I do think, based on Dr. Erwin's comments, that "
> temporary fencing" to separate least tern chicks from a vehicle corridor
> (e.g., east side of Cape Point) may be feasible (or at least does not have
> strong objections) and is worth exploring further.
