The Park has determined the researcher was properly credentialed and followed the appropriate techniques in attempting to capture and band the chick. The death was determined as accidental. Permission for the researcher to band AMOYs has been reinstated, as the Park believes the benefits of continued banding of AMOYs on the Seashore outweigh the risks.
