I know I am in the minority, but I support all that the NPS and others have done to restrict the use of the national park to a more reasonable level. As a long-time visitor to the park (annually since '64) I have seen rampant economic development and virtually unregulated ORV access to the beaches that have changed the essential nature of what brought us to this area in the first place. It is time that the pendulum swung the other way, despite the protests of those who need to duck their heads for a little while.

We have, over the years, practiced a pack it in/pack it out philosophy in our use of the national parks.
