Talking with M. Baker and then discussing it with the Ranger Staff at a meeting yesterday, I am suggesting that we can make a compendium change that would reflect "no beach fires with-in 100 yards [or meters] of the turtle closure...". This is in response to the incident on Avon Beach two weeks ago. The hatchlings crawled approximately 100 yards from their nest to the fire.

If this goes into effect, the majority of Avon beach south of the pier will have no fires allowed due to the cluster of turtle nests.

I am okay with this. For this to be timely and enforceable, Mike would have to make the changes quickly. Please advise Norah, Paul, Jon, Kenny, and I ASAP.
