Hi Doug,

I talked to Ross who put the information together and here are answers to you questions.

1. The data is from the 2000 Census, which places people according to "usual residence" guidelines. These dictate that people are counted where they live most of the year.

2. The ROI includes parts of Dare County north of Whalebone junction. We expect that the villages and businesses adjacent to the park will experience a greater impact than the businesses north of whalebone junction. The data are for the entire ROI at whatever level it is available. We could add the locations of the towns and villages to the maps we provided so the reader knows where things are. Do you want us to add statements about the area south of whalebone junction versus north of it?

2. In the beginning of the Socioeconomic Resources section, you make the following statement: "Located within this area are towns and villages that would be most affected by the proposed actions, including several villages on Hatteras Islands and Ocracoke (Ocracoke, Hatteras, Frisco, Avon, Buxton, Salvo, Waves, and Rodanthe)." However, there is no further discussion of the businesses or residents of the villages. We were just wondering why they weren't discussed when it was stated that they would be the most affected.
