Night Driving at Spits

Dear Mike,

 $\,$ After examination of the Turtle maps for the 2008 annual report, it is obvious that the NPS approach to ban night ORV driving is untenable for all the spits in CAHA.

Under the Consent Decree there was no night driving on any spit in 2008. The maps show that there were no turtle nests on these spits. In addition there were

no turtle crawls on Bodie, Hatteras, and north Ocracoke spits. There were two crawls below Ramp 72. These crawls were certainly not the result of human activity forcing Mom turtle to go away to some less optional site.

In light of this best science (data from CAHA beaches) you should make changes to the NPS management "Alternatives" and "AdaptiveManagement Proposal for Night Hours". These changes should provide for recreational ORV access to the spits at night. For the NPS to continue advocating ORV bans without factual justification would appear capricious and punitive to the villagers and the other visitors to CAHA.
