Hi Steve,

We have a paragraph in the draft Chapter 1 for the CAHA ORV draft EIS about Special Use Permits and Permitted Activities. In his comments on the draft, Mike asked us to check with you on the general range of permit fees (he thought that \$50 - \$200 was more likely than the \$100 - \$500 used in the draft).

Would you email me the range that we should use to be accurate, please?  
Thanks.

Here is the draft paragraph so you can see the context.

A special use permit is required for activities at the Seashore that provide a benefit to an individual, group, or organization, rather than the public at large, and that require some degree of management from the NPS to protect park resources and the public interest. Examples include religious ceremonies, weddings, fishing tournaments, surfing tournaments, commercial filming, bike tours, marathons, car rallies, and public speeches and assemblies. Permit fees vary and generally range between \$100 and \$500. However, an additional fee is charged for any activity that requires NPS personnel participation or monitoring, or that creates extraordinary administrative work. The full cost is charged for restoration of park resources including litter cleanup (NPS nd 1) [Citation is to National Park Service, Department of the Interior.
