Dear Dr. Berry, As of this morning, there were maybe 5 or 6 of the 19 piping plovers left that hatched in the Cape Point area. The thick vegetation around the pond has made it difficult for them to forage there. The dense area is also contains numerous snakes and other natural predators. The bio-tec also said they were on the far side of the pond basically were they have been. Still 500+ meters from the north beach and the historic Point. No harm at all if there was a walking corridor to the Point. Again, this made up non-science buffer is ridicules. The one piping plover seen across from the lighthouse has not been spotted again. If Audubon was so concerned with increasing numbers, they should have sued for creating better habit over closing down the public's Park. Many out of state birders I talked to are very upset too.
