# Russ and Mike,

Darrell and I had a conference call today with NC Wildlife Resource Commission Director Gordon Myers and his deputy chief to discuss improving interagency information sharing and coordination on our breeding colonial waterbird (CWB) monitoring efforts. In the short term, CAHA and WRC would like to coordinate our respective CWB nest counts in and around Cape Hatteras during the peak nesting period (late May - early June). Presently, WRC monitors CWB nesting on the spoil islands adjacent to the Seashore once every 3 years, while we monitor annually. Under that approach, (which includes using somewhat different survey methods and uncoordinated timing), it is difficult to assess the overall status of the area CWB population since CWB move between our respective jurisdictions, which makes it difficult to get an accurate overall nest count or analyze the population trends in the larger area. For example, if the CWB nest counts in the Seashore decrease and those on the spoil island increase (or vice versa), is it because "our" birds moved to and nested on the spoil islands (or vice versa)? If the overall area population is stable or increasing, is it a concern that there is a decline at some sites if it is offset by gains at nearby sites? Or, if the overall area population is declining, what are the cause(s) and if there are some sites that are more successful at fledging chicks than others, what are the reasons? We talked briefly about a more complex issue than coordinating nest counts, which is determining CWB breeding productivity (i.e., nesting success, chick fledge rate, etc.) This is an issue that we all seem to struggle with and the could be some benefits from interagency collaboration in the future. During the call we agreed that understanding the status of CWB nesting for the larger area is important and we want to work toward using similar survey methodology and coordinated timing before next breeding season begins. Obviously, this effort will present an incomplete picture of the overall area CWB breeding population if Pea Island NWR and Cape Lookout NS are not considered too.

In the long-term, we talked about the potential to enter into an interagency agreement (MOU) to improve interagency coordination within the "Greater Outer Banks" area, similar to what has been done in other parts of the country (such as the Greater Yellowstone Coordinating Committee, which is mentioned below). We think such an agreement would provide a framework for working together on other wildlife management issues of mutual interest.

Before ending the call, we agreed to the following as next steps:

- Have our respective biological staffs work together this winter to discuss CWB peak nesting survey methods and attempt to work out procedures and timing of an annual peak nesting survey for our respective jurisdictions.
- Explore the possibility of developing an MOU to provide a framework for future collaboration on other issues.
- I would let both of you know of the discussion and invite you to participate in both the short-term and long-term efforts, since your involvement would present a truer picture of the area-wide CWB population.

This message is to make you aware of the discussion and to invite you (or your staffs) to participate in future discussions and to share the information contained in the message below. Gordon seemed very committed to moving forward on coordinating CWB peak nest counts during the next breeding season and I would anticipate some sort of follow-up conference call or meeting focused on that issue in the next few months. I expect that development of an overarching agreement will be a slow moving process.

Please feel free to pass this information along to your staffs or to call if you have any questions. I would appreciate a response as to whether you (or your designee) are interested in participating in future discussions about coordinating the nest counts or about the possibility of developing the MOU.

# Gordon,

It was good to talk to you and Mallory. See below for information (attached MOU and website link) about the Greater Yellowstone Coordinating Committee, which may be a worthwhile model to consider. GYCC has evolved over 20 years and is a mature interagency collaboration, with established working groups that have developed joint guidelines for various issues. If you have time to check their website and look at "Subcommittees," it's clear that the agencies have utilized the MOU framework to work together on a variety of issues of mutual concern. Obviously, we need to start small and focus first on practical issues, such as coordinating our colonial waterbird surveys, but I think we have the potential for the partnership to grow over time into something like the GYCC.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

#### Between

The Intermountain Region NATIONAL PARK SERVICE,

The Northern, Rocky Mountain and Intermountain Regions FOREST SERVICE,

and

The Mountain Prairie Region FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (agreement) is made and entered into by and between the Intermountain Region of the National Park Service, the Northern, Rocky Mountain and Intermountain Regions of the US Forest Service, and the Mountain Prairie Region of the US Fish and Wildlife Service.

#### I. BACKGROUND

All three agencies have previously affirmed their relationship in the Greater Yellowstone Area (GYA), and as members of the Greater Yellowstone Coordinating Committee (GYCC), through the 1964, 1986 and 2003 MOUs, previous Interagency Agreements, and through a history of coordinated working relationships.

# II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to document the intentions and provide a framework for providing public services and responsible land management in a cooperative and coordinated manner, as the GYCC, to the extent permissible by law and agency missions, throughout the GYA.

# III. STATEMENT OF MUTUAL BENEFITS AND INTERESTS

It is the desire of all parties to cooperate fully in matters relating to responsible land management throughout the GYA. These cooperative efforts include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Provide leadership in making coordinated decisions that serve the public and help sustain resources in the GYA.
- 2. Ensure coordination of planning, strategies, and practices across national park, national forest and national wildlife refuge units in the GYA.
- 3. Set GYCC level priorities and assign resources to achieve goals.
- 4. Foster a climate that encourages interaction, coordination and cooperation with federal, state, local agencies, private organizations, and the public.
- 5. Identify and facilitate resolution of emerging issues within the GYA.

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- 6. Minimize duplication of effort; seek opportunities to share information, resources, and data.
- 7. To the extent permissible by law and agency missions, make rules and regulations consistent across the GYA.

#### IV. THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE SHALL:

Supervise and support the GYCC Executive Coordinator's position. Contribute resources, subject to funding and resource availability, and support for achieving GYCC priorities. Implement the purpose and objectives of the MOU and GYCC priority work

# V. THE US FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE SHALL:

Contribute resources, subject to funding and resource availability, and support for achieving GYCC priorities. Implement the purpose and objectives of the MOU and GYCC priority work

#### VI. THE US FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

Contribute resources, subject to funding and resource availability, and support for achieving GYCC priorities. Implement the purpose and objectives of the MOU and GYCC priority work

# VII. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

- A. <u>MEETINGS</u>. The parties shall meet two times each year, generally in the spring and fall. Special meetings and field trips to address important regional issues may be necessary and may be called by the chairperson.
- B. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Any information furnished to the Forest Service under this agreement is subject to the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552).
- C. <u>MODIFICATION</u>. Modifications within the scope of the agreement shall be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification, signed and dated by all parties, prior to any changes being performed.
- D. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This MOU in no way restricts the National Park Service, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service or U.S. Forest Service from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- E. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. This agreement is executed as of the date of last signature and shall remain in effect for 5 Years from the date of execution at which time it will expire.
- F. <u>TERMINATION</u>. Any of the parties, in writing, may terminate the agreement in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration.
