Doug,

Good questions. On page 5 of the Alt F maps, I would show the two new interdunal roads as being about 2x longer than what is currently shown (e.g., the SW extension should reach about half-way to False Point (the big protrusion on the south shoreline of the map). The terminus of each new section of interdunal road would serve as an ORV parking area, from which there would be pedestrian (only) access along the ocean beach to False Point and the inlet, except when the prenesting area or other closures are in effect. In other words, the purpose of the new interdunal roads, in conjunction with the existing Pole Road, is to get people near to the ocean shoreline within reasonable walking distance of False Point and the inlet (when the ocean beach is NOT closed for prenesting), even though it is a "non-ORV area". Note: Spur Road would provide ORV access to near the inlet on the sound side; but, based on the current pattern of breeding activity, should not be affected during prenesting unless/until breeding activity is observed and prompts a closure.

See attached hand-drawn maps showing the Alternative F interdunal routes at Hatteras Inlet and North Ocracoke. The drawings are conceptual, location and distance approximate, although the North Ocracoke interdunal route is specifically (approximately) 0.3 mile long from Ramp 59.

Hopefully, these maps will clarify for Doug what was intended by the text description. If you need a presentation-ready clean digital map, that will take a few days.
