Hi Britta, Doug, et al.

After reviewing the SECN report, CAHA wintering data (downloaded), and available literature for AMOY and WIPL, it's become pretty clear that these birds don't winter at the Seashore.

Is there any value to including bar charts for this data?

Also, I've not been able to reproduce the SECN wintering data for AMOY (just cut and paste from the SECN report, which states that AMOY don't winter in the Seashore) due to some apparent issues with the tabular data that Sandy downloaded from the SECN database. I'm somewhat uncomfortable using this downloaded, unpublished data when I can just use literature and the published SECN text regarding AMOYs.

Please let me know what you think. Chapter 3 will probably go to the editor on Tuesday, so a quick response would be most appreciated.
