Sherri,

We currently are referring to the updated report in the DEIS as "Cohen, **2009**" (with the full title cited in the list of references). Given the information from John French below about saying it is "**in press**" rather than listing a publication date (until it is actually published), and given we are at the end of the year and trying to finish the camera ready version of the DEIS before Christmas, are we safe to refer to the report as "Cohen, 2009" or do we need to say "Cohen, in press"? It would be best if the report were published before we release the DEIS, but since there is lag time between the camera ready venison of the DIES and its actual release, I don't want to publish a DEIS that refers to the report as "2009" if it is not going to be published until 2010.

Do we think it will be published before the end of the year? Any advice of what would be the safest approach? Unless we have confirmation from USGS that "publication" is imminent and will be published this month, my inclination would be to go with "Cohen, in press." What do you think?
