Thanks for the response and explanation. Upon hearing that, I think with that particular soundside access (south of Ramp 72), it is okay to identify it only in the matrix. While it will run a short distance perpendicular to the "ORV corridor" that is along the beach, it is still within the general area of what would be the "designated route" so I think it would be adequately covered by the "route designation" described in the Routes and Areas Table and presumably to be described in the draft special regulation.

On page ES-20, you questioned whether this was the most up to date Routes and Areas table because it didn't mention the new soundside ORV access point south of ramp 72. It is the most up to date version, as I don't believe that we had the soundside access points listed on it. Sandy and I discussed where soundside access should be addressed and thought that it belonged in the Alternatives Matrix under the descriptions of soundside access. However, if you would like me to add the new soundside access point to the R&A table, I would be more than happy to. It can certainly be in both places.
