The "street legal" issue is relevant to ATVs only. The "ORV Characteristics Requirements" in the DEIS (Table 8, p. 109) for Alternative C-F are, in fact, based on the Committee documents, with NPS judgment (in alternatives C, D, and F) that allowing off-road motorcycle use in some circumstances (such as sound access points and interdunal roads) but not others (such as ocean beaches) wold be problematic to implement, communicate, comply with, and enforce. Note: alternative F would allow motorcycles on the ocean beach as described in the Committee documents.

# Doug,

There were multiple RegNeg subcommittee documents recommending that "motorcycles are prohibited on the ocean beach." For example, see attached documents from Sept 2008 and January 2009. The reasons for the prohibition on the ocean beaches are as Paul describes, as well as for concerns about resource impacts of allowing noisier, more mobile vehicles (dirt bikes, etc.) in beach nesting habitat. In addition, some stakeholders on the committee suggested that off-road motorcycles not be allowed anywhere. Since there was no history of much use heretofore or related problems, it was suggested that it was better to preclude the activity than to allow it to become a problem in the future.

The implication of "no motorcycles on the ocean beach" as described in the RegNeg documents was that motorcycles could or should be allowed at NPS discretion on (some) other off-road vehicle routes, such as (potentially) sound access points and interdunal roads. After the Committee failed to reach consensus, NPS considered the Committee's input and determined that if the policy were to be "no motorcycles on the ocean beach" but motorcycles were allowed off-road in other locations, it would be complicated operationally to manage, sign and enforce; it would allow or encourage an increase is use in locations that are not well suited for it, such as vegetated sound shorelines; and it would be difficult for visitors to understand and comply with motorcycles but not ATVs being allowed on some but potentially not all sound access areas and interdunal roads, especially when some interdunal routes lead to the ocean beach (Pole Road, etc.). In keeping with the concept that ORV use at the Seashore is primarily for transportation purposes, NPS decided to have the motorcycles prohibition apply to all ORV routes, consistent with the ATV restriction.
