I have added my comments into the version you provided below. As requested, I added a paragraph on why relocation or a captive breeding program for PIPs would not be a good idea (Pg. 128). One other thing that I saw in a number of places was a reference to 105 meter buffer around turtle nests. When I read this I think of a circular buffer as we have for birds. I modified this to read 105 meter wide buffers. Table 10 (Pg 125) of the DEIS correctly explains the way buffers will be installed- "On the landward side of the nest, the closed area will be expanded to 15 meters from the nest where possible, but no less than 10 meters landward from the nest."
