## Larry,

We've taken a preliminary look at your suggestion. As you well know, the functions and management mandates of Peas Island National Wildlife Refuge and Cape Hatteras National Seashore are different. It is fairly standard for national wildlife refuges to manipulate habitat for wildlife management purposes. This is not necessarily the case with National Parks. The guidance for management activities, including habitat manipulation, biological resource management, water resource management, and geological resource management are generally covered in the NPS Management Policies, 2006, Section 4, Natural Resource Management. Having said this, we will continue to consider your suggestion as a potential future initiative if we determine that it is consistent with NPS policy and the actual implementation of such an effort is cost effective and manageable.
