There would be a small "parking area" at the terminus of the Pole Road extension for Hatteras Spit (see attached concept map). Under revised Alternative F, we would have a total of 12 new surfaced parking areas (accessible to street vehicles from paved roads) and 2 unsurfaced "parking areas" (accessible from ORV routes by ORVs

only). As discussed previously, "surfaced" is the right word to use, not "paved".

I know that 12 surfaced areas sounds like an increase in the number of parking areas (it is); however, it would provide a total of 135 additional parking spaces, so the total footprint of new development would be less than that described for Alternative F in the DEIS (which had fewer but bigger parking lots). The revised approach is to have more, smaller parking areas to provide more access options and to increase the chances that more access points remain open during the bird nesting season, if some are closed due to nesting activity.
