Subject: Wilson's plover

### **Reproductive Success at Cape Hatteras National Seashore**

The first documented Wilson's plover nest was found in 2009. A three-egg nest was found in June, hatched in July, and produced one chick. The chick was not observed during subsequent observations and is not believed to have fledged (Muiznieks pers. comm. 2009). During the 2010 breeding season, two nests were documented on Ocracoke Island. One of these nests successfully fledged two chicks (Muiznieks pers. comm. 2010).
