In your edited draft below in Table 7-1 I replaced "repaved" with "resurfaced" to be more consistent with p. 2 of the FONSI for relocation of the old Coast Guard Station. It says that after potential use as a restaging area for widening and repaving of NC 12, the old Coast Guard Station's access roads, parking areas, and concrete walkways will be "potentially removed as mitigation for floodplain impacts resulting from that action"

I would consider removing asphalt and resurfacing with pervious material consistent with floodplain mitigation. I think we should keep that open consistent with the FONSI.






