### Hi Sandy and Lori,

I got Sandy's voicemail from yesterday about the difference between the % visiting historic sites in the U. of ID 2002 study and ours. A couple of comments:

- 1. The visitor survey project (VSP) surveys, if I am remembering correctly, are a convenience sample. You should probably check the documentation, but I think a lot of times they put the survey cards on car windshields or just stop people who are visiting. They may well have surveyed at the lighthouse, since it is a popular attraction. That would give a higher percent saying they visited historic sites.
- 2. Our survey intercepted people on the beach, not at the lighthouse. So we did not talk to people who only come down to see the lighthouse and don't go out on the beach.
- 3. In terms of the percent who visited the lighthouse and historic sites, there is going to be overlap between the 22% who visited lighthouses and the 18% who visited historic sites. You can't add the two percents together, but the combined total will probably be bigger than 22%.

Ross – can you calculate for Lori the percent who visited the lighthouse and/or other historic sites?
