The inlet shorelines at BI Spit and South Point were designated as year-round vehicle free as a compromise between those who thought all inlets should be VF (e.g., USGS recommended all inlets and Cape Point be VF year-round) and those who wanted them all open to ORVs all the time. We identified those miles as VF, in part, to help balance the amount of VF and ORV miles, and to respond to the resource concerns about ORV use in those areas. In addition, at BI Spit a research project around 05-06 documented the importance of the Bait Pond mudflats and the inlet shoreline to migrating and nonbreeding PIPL. We designed the ORV routes at BI Spit (nonbreeding season only) and South Point (year-round) so that visitors could at least drive along the ocean beach to the inlet and then walk along the inlet shorelines, which are the most resource sensitive areas, to fish, etc..

Hope this helps.

few comments from me (questions for you), so that you could look at the places where you had questions. Hopefully table 3-5 is improved. I took out some of the rows for areas that we didn't have vehicle ramp crossing counts for. Since I was not quite sure how much of the beach was closed in

2009 in each area (for example, if "cape point" was closed, how much of the beach around it was closed), so I may not have the comparisons exactly right. The table is only meant to provide a rough estimate of the differences between the action alternatives and alt B and resource closures will change from year to year - so I don't think we need to make it too detailed. But let me know if you think it needs to be revised more.
