Thank you for your comments. Your inquiry was forwarded to me to respond.

Given the number of cats occurring on the National Seashore, it is not practical for the National Park Service to try to determine the pet owner, so trapped cats are typically transferred to the Dare County Animal Shelter, located in Manteo, NC. I understand that the shelter will notify the pet owner if there is owner contact information on the animal (e.g. on the collar or rabies tag). Absent the owner information, it may be beneficial for you to contact the animal shelter with a description of the animal(s) you are looking for. Their number is: 252-475-5620.
