Jon,
Thanks for your message. I believe that individual businesses that cater to ORV users (e.g., tackle shops near popular fishing sites that are also important shorebird nesting areas) have likely been impacted during the temporary resource protection closures under the consent decree; however, in terms of the overall economy, 2010 was a record year for total gross occupancy revenue in Dare County. Attached is the latest gross occupancy summary provided by the Outer Banks Visitors Bureau, which shows data since 1998. Thus far, 2011 (J anuary - March) has been more profitable than the same period in 2010 (the record year).

This has a long history, including litigation, full EIS, and a failed negotiated
rule making. Stickland was comfortable with where we landed on the FEIS and ROD and where we will be on the final reg. Before KLS takes any such meeting, we will need to brief him, as will USFWS on the ESA issues. I believe we have struck the right balance, and do not believe there will be significant economic impact to the community, but it is a change to the way the Seashore has been operated.
