Try this:

Once the new plan and special regulation go into effect, there will be a designated year-round ORV route along the ocean shoreline to the edge of Ocracoke Inlet as indicated by the GREEN line on the attached map (Alternative F Map # 7 from the final ORV management plan/EIS). From the end of the ORV corridor, pedestrian access will be allowed along the inlet shoreline and portions of the sound shoreline. These areas will be subject to resource closures, as needed, during the breeding season. At the north end of the spit (i.e., just south of the last vegetated dune line), there will also be a seasonal ORV route (Sept 15 - Mar 14) from the ocean shoreline over to the sound shoreline (as indicated by the RED line on the map).
