Subject ORV PERMIT FEES

Dear Supt Murray: I don't know what the new ORV permit details will include. From the recent installation of the Permit Trailers it is obvious that you intend to pursue a permit fee. I would expect some initial resistance from the island villagers who feel that beach access must be free by virtue of the NPS promises made in the 1950s as part of the land acquisitions. I request you include an " Early Bird " special in your fee structure. A half price discount for the first month of each annual permit would be beneficial to generate early funds and soften the public pain. I believe such a process already exists at Acadia , Maine.
