## Mike:

I have let a few day pass since Mr. Moore's rude and arrogant outburst while I addressed the Neg/Reg group. Most of the objection to his outburst came from others in the room, not from you or the chairman. I fully understand Mr. Moore's boredom! He has already achieved and accomplished more against ORV beach usage that he ever imagined, so now he must sit there, eating and drinking, half-awake and not paying attention as the months pass, offering nothing to the group.

I left after that because had I stayed any longer, your "incident group' might have had work to do! The Hatteras Bird Club should not ever be seated at the table, and I will forward a document to you which will give you deeper insight into the club, how few members it has, and how poorly organized it is.

By refusing to defend your position in court ( and I know this was not your personal decision), NPS has , in effect, turned the park management over to the three groups who will work eliminate beach driving. They do not want to negotiate except the end of ORV access, and they hold most of the cards for now.
