Hello All,

Carol has to be back in Raleigh 3:00 Wednesday afternoon. She could stay Tuesday night to meet with the economic subcommittee, BUT she also needs to see the beach areas and accesses to help determine where the counting and intercepts should be, so it would be helpful for her to also go on the tour rather than missing it to meet with the subcommittee. Also some of the subcommittee members may also not be familiar with the area so the tour would be helpful to them, too. (Yes, I realize I'm arguing against my own idea here.)

Because the Tuesday agenda item for economic discussion with the full committee was premised on a Monday meeting with the subcommittee, I now wonder if we're not better off to get input from the whole committee on Tuesday and forget about a separate subcommittee meeting later Tuesday night. Another option would be to have a quick 30 minute subcommittee meeting Tuesday morning before the committee meeting starts.

Here is what I think the subcommittee meeting, if there is one, might cover:

1. Input from the subcommittee on best sites for counting and visitor intercepts.
2. Patti Doerr's emailed questions (includes a number of items like timing)
3. Update on OMB approval process
4. Mike's idea about a standard form for business effect.

#2 and 3 could be handled with an email before the mtg. #1 could happen in the full committee about as easily as in the subcommittee. I gave Carol the time and number for our call tomorrow if it's convenient for her to join us.

FYI. Jim Gramann says that if we're asking individual businesses to provide individual information on a "common form" (i.e. information that isn't available from public sources), then the "common form" has to go through the full OMB approval process also. He advises against anymore dealing with OMB than necessary. We've been informed that the business survey also has to go through the full OMB approval process (not the expedited process) because everything about CAHA is so controversial. Carol is doing the FR notice and accompanying justifications/statements, but would like input from the group on sites for the visitor intercepts first. The counting doesn't need to involve OMB so that will start later this summer, but input from the committee on suggested sites for counting is also desired.
