Here's some further thinking on the general education question offered by Mike.

- There are generally two target audiences for education: ORV operators and

All other beach users.

- The NPS prefers a consolidated approach to the extent practicable.

- For example, one might work jointly with Tread Lightly (motorized recreation orientation) and Leave No Trace (non-motorized recreation orientation) to develop an education program. There is some overlap in content for both audiences (bird and sea turtle protection measures, resource closures, pets, etc.), as well as some things that do not overlap (ORV vehicle requirements).

- If one consolidated approach is not possible, we may need to have two separate education "programs" (content and delivery system), but it would be good if they both looked similar and were complementary (or maybe both had similar "core content" but the ORV program had an additional component focused on vehicular use).

- This is one of those areas in which the committee can make a general conceptual recommendation to have a consolidated education program suitable for ORV and non-ORV users, then leave it to future implementation to work out the details before the plan goes into effect.
