Thanks Lynn.

The RegNeg Routes and Areas subcommittee today made a promising change in their potential consensus alternative which would affect ORV or non-ORV designations both north and south of Coquina Beach. I.e., they are now proposing that Ramp 1 to just south of Coquina Beach be non-ORV and just south of Coquina Beach to Ramp 4 be ORV.

When you get a chance, would you please evaluate and recommend a spot for a new Ramp 2 that is 1/4 to 1/2 mile south of the current location for Ramp 2 (or, at least far enough south of the swimming beach that the ramp could remain open to ORV year-round. Please identify a specific distance south of current ramp 2 and identify any issues of concerns that may affect feasibility of the site (e.g., narrow beach, etc.). AND, please look for and recommend a site for a new "Ramp 3" that is a bit farther south than you identified below, if possible (as far south as you think may be feasible, but north of the campground and north of the high dune field that is just north of the campground).
